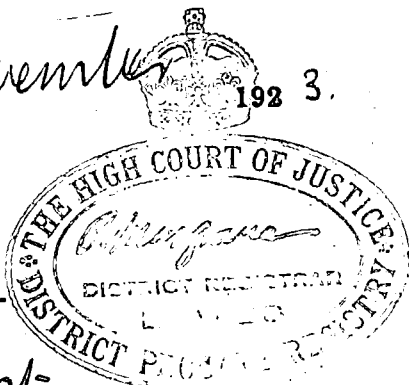

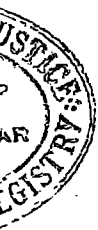

I William Standen Dengate of Ticehurst in the County of Sussex Hairdresser and Perfumer hereby revoke all Wills and testamentary dispositions heretofore made by me and declare this to be my last Will I appoint my dear Wife Caroline Lucy Dengate and my Sons William Percy Dengate and Philip Dengate to be the Executors and Trustees of this my Will and they and the survivor or survivors of them and the Executors and administrators of such survivor or other the Trustees or Trustee for the time being of this my Will are hereinafter called my Trustees I direct that all my just debts funeral testamentary and incidental expenses be first paid I bequeath to my dear Wife Caroline Lucy Dengate the sum of Twenty pounds to be paid to her within one calendar month after my death I bequeath all my household goods furniture plate linen glass china and other articles of household use and ornament other than the stock in trade and effects used in my business to my Trustees hereinbefore named Upon trust to permit my Wife to have the use and enjoyment thereof during her widowhood so long as she may wish And after her death or remarriage again I direct that the same shall fall into and form part of my residuary estate and be held upon the trusts thereof And I bequeath the business of a Hairdresser and Perfumer as now carried on by me at Ticehurst aforesaid together with the stock in trade and effects used in such business to my Trustees Upon trust that my Trustees shall carry on such business for such time as my said Wife and my Trustees may consider advisable and for that purpose employ such part of my personal estate therein as they may think proper and with power for the purpose aforesaid to raise money by mortgage of my real

estate and also to employ my said son William Percy Dengate as manager of such business at such remuneration as they may deem proper and do all acts necessary for that purpose and shall apply the annual profits arising therefrom and from the income of such part of my personal estate as may be invested at the time of my death for and towards the maintenance of my said wife so long as she shall remain my widow and unmarried and when and so soon as it may be considered advisable that such business should be given up or after the death or second marriage of my said wife which event shall first happen I hereby in consideration of the assistance rendered to me in carrying on my business by my said son William Percy Dengate bequeath the said business of a hairdresser and perfumer as carried on by me together with the stock-in-trade fittings utensils and effects used in such business and the book debts to my said son William Percy Dengate provided that if such business be given up during the widowhood of my said wife my said son William Percy Dengate shall pay to my said wife out of the profits arising from such business so long as she shall continue my widow and unmarried a sum of not less than fifteen shillings per week and I declare that such bequest to my said son William Percy Dengate shall be in addition to and not in substitution for the bequest of the share of my residuary estate hereinafter mentioned I give devise and bequeath my freehold dwellinghouse shop and premises situate at Hicehurst in the County of Sussex and all other my real property and also all my personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever not hereby otherwise specifically bequeathed unto and to the use of my

Trustees herebefore named Upon Trust to permit my said Wife personally to occupy my said dwellinghouse and premises during her widowhood so long as she may desire free from all rent but she paying the proportion of the rates taxes expenses of repair and insurance and other outgoings in respect of such part of the said premises as she may occupy and so that my said Wife shall permit such part of my said dwellinghouse shop and premises as may be required for such purpose to be used for carrying on the said business And upon further trust that my Trustees shall after the death or second marriage of my said Wife or during her widowhood should she so desire in the first place give to my said Son William Percy Dugate notwithstanding his being a Trustee of this my Will the option to purchase my said dwellinghouse shop and premises at a price to be fixed by a competent Valuer to be appointed by my trustees for that purpose such option to be exercised by my said Son within one calendar month after the death or second marriage of my said Wife or if to be sold during her widowhood then within one month of her giving her consent to the sale thereof And should my said Son exercise such option within such time the same shall be sold to him at the price fixed as aforesaid but if my said Son shall not exercise such option within such time then I direct my Trustees to sell the said real estate and call in sell and convert into money such part of my personal estate as does not consist of money with power for my Trustees to postpone such sale and conversion for such period as they may think proper And shall stand possessed of the monies to arise from the sale and



conversion of my said real and personal estate
and my ready money if such sale and conversion
take place during the widowhood of my said
Wife I in trust to invest the same in any investments
which for the time being are authorised as investments
for trust money and with power at their discretion
to change any such investments for others of a like
kind And I declare that my Trustees shall stand
possessed of the investments hereinbefore directed
to be made or authorised to be retained Upon trust
to pay the Income thereof to my Wife for her
separate use without power of anticipation
during her widowhood And after her death or
marriage again which shall first happen
Then I direct that the capital and Income of the
Trust fund shall be held In trust for my two Sons
William Percy Dengate and Philip Dengate in
equal shares as Tenants in common In witness
whereof I the said William Standen Dengate
have to this my Will contained in this and
the two preceding sheets set my hand this second
day of March One thousand nine hundred and no
Signed and acknowledged by the above
named Testator William Standen
Dengate as and for his last Will and
Testament in the presence of us present
at the same time who at his request
in his presence and in the presence
of each other have hereunto subscribed
our names as witnesses
